



Editors' note

We are glad that our e-journal TDE has been met with wide approval from reviewers and readers so far. We appreciate the feedback we have gotten and have already implemented some of the suggestions that have been made, e.g., adding the year of a paper's original publication to the volume's table of contents. We have also tried to improve the readability by making some adjustments to the typefaces we use and the canon of page construction. Many comments explicitly emphasized the benefit of gaining access to historical, "classical" papers. We will certainly continue to include such publications in upcoming volumes of TDE.

However, after successfully publishing two volumes of TDE we have found it necessary to make one particular change due to the time and effort required to select and prepare relevant papers for publication. We certainly underestimated this aspect and have therefore decided to postpone providing HTML versions of the papers in order to cut down on our workload. PDF versions can be printed out if necessary and lend themselves more easily to refer to them in quotations so we hope they will suffice for the time being.

One point of criticism that has come up is that the members of our Editorial Board display a Eurocentric orientation of TDE. However, they should not be considered to be representatives of their respective countries, but as experts for some of the languages which we try to cover and who can point us to potentially relevant papers that have been published in these languages. We will definitely need to add board members for more languages in the near future, and this is already an important item on our to-do list.
